Barry Rassin, President, Rotary International 2018-2019

Barry Rassin, of the Rotary Club of East Nassau, New Providence, Bahamas, earned an MBA



in health and hospital administration from the University of Florida and is the first fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives in the Bahamas. He recently retired after 37 years as president of Doctors Hospital Health System, where he continues to

serve as an adviser. He is a lifetime member of the American Hospital Association and has served on several boards, including the Quality Council of the Bahamas, Health Education Council, and Employer's Confederation. A Rotarian since 1980, Rassin has served Rotary as director and as vice chair of The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees. He was an RI training leader and the aide to 2015-16 RI President K.R. Ravindran.

Rassin received Rotary's highest honor, the Service Above Self Award, as well as other humanitarian awards for his work leading Rotary's relief efforts in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake there. He and his wife, Esther, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation.

Conor Gee, 114th President, Rotary Club of Chicago

Conor manages the Product Portfolio Optimization team for Health Care Service Corporation

(which operates Blue Cross and Blue Shield plans in five states), the largest customer-owned health insurance company in the United States. Gee is the youngest President in the 114-year history of the Rotary Club of Chicago.



He started Associate/Young Professional Groups for Misericordia and the Chicago Parks Foundations and currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Chicago Parks Foundation. He is also a founding member of the Associate Board for Navy Pier. He has been recognized by SociaLife Chicago as a Next Generation Philanthropist for Chicago and has been highlighted in the book "Manager 3.0: A Millennial's Guide to Rewriting the Rules of Management". Gee has a bachelor's degree in Integrated Communications from Spring Hill College, a MBA from Dominican University and a Certificate in Nonprofit Governance from North Park University. He resides in Elmhurst with his wife, Rebecca and their daughter, Maggie.

Khaled Akkawi, President, Rotary Club of Chicago 2018-2019

Khaled Akkawi has been a member of ROTA-RY/One Chicago since 2007, and is currently the President-elect for the 2018-2019 term. He serves on several district 6450 and club committees and also participates in committees focused on providing internships and job training to high school students. He is a Rotary Foundation, Paul Harris +8 and ROTARY/One Foundation Ches Perry Fellow.

For more than 35 years, Khaled has enjoyed a

successful career as a serialentrepreneur, leveraging his operational expertise to build and grow his ventures in retail, tax and consumer services, finance and investment services and real estate.

After earning his MBA in 1991, he owned and operated several Jackson Hewitt franchises throughout the Greater Chicagoland area and received numerous national franchisee awards and recognition for operation and consistent growth in his franchise territories.

Khaled was also one of the founders of the first ever US Arab-American formed federally chartered bank, United Trust Bank, where he served as Vice Chair of the Board.

Khaled's current business focus is LIYA Investment Group, Ltd., specializing in residential and commercial real estate investment, development and management. And while, today, Khaled is recognized as a highly accomplished entrepreneur, his story begins with the humble beginnings of the American Dream.

Khaled immigrated from Jordan to the United States at the age of 15, where he balanced school work and partnering in the family-run grocery business. He continued to play a large part in the grocery business while also completing his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from IIT. Shortly thereafter, Khaled quickly discovered that his true passion was business. He never worked a day in his life as an Engineer.

Notwithstanding his drive towards entrepreneurship, Khaled has always been committed to local and global community outreach as well as humanitarian, charitable and community development programs. Khaled served as a delegate to the Middle East North Africa Economic Summits held in Amman, Jordan and Cairo, Egypt, which were led by US Secretaries of Commerce, Ron Brown (1995) and Mickey Kantor (1996), during President Clinton's administration. His

participation in these delegations provided him with the opportunity for the formation of an Amman-Chicago Sister Cities Committee, an international partnership and network to foster and facilitate best practices through citizen to citizen connections and charitable causes. As a result of the initial fundraiser, six ambulances were donated and delivered to towns in Jordan. Khaled also served as an ambassador in a People to People International trip to Amman, Jordan.

Khaled also sponsored and volunteered at various programs involving inner city youth in Chicago. And for more than 20 years, he has been a valued donor and supporter of the annual St. Jude Children's Research Hospital Four Stars of Chicago fundraiser. He is also a founder in the fundraising efforts for the expansion of an orphanage and children's home located in the Middle East. In 2014, Khaled was honored with the Humanitarian of the Year Award from the Phoenician Club. He is also the past Parish Council President of St. John the Baptist Church.

Khaled is fluent in Arabic and enjoys spending time with his family; participating in church activities and programs; attending theater, opera, concerts and sporting events. He is a passionate sailor and a member of the Columbia Yacht Club and the Union League Club. He is always looking for new adventures and endeavors. Khaled's family includes his wife Aida, daughter Liana and son Yazin.

Paul Harris (1868-1947)

Born in Racine, Wisconsin and raised in Vermont by his grandparents, Paul was the Rotary movement founder. In 1897 he settled in Chicago and established a law practice. However, he missed the close social relationships typical of small towns. Paul developed an idea for a club which would band together business and professional men in friendship and fellowship.

On February 23, 1905, the Rotary Club's first meeting took place in Room 711 in Chicago's Unity Building (now where Block 37 stands). Paul named the club "Rotary" because the members met, in rotation, at their various places of business. The idea caught on, first in other U.S. cities and then in other countries. Today there are over 33,000 clubs in more than 200 countries with over 1.2 million members. In 114 years, one man's idea has become a worldwide force for service and international fellowship.

Members have donated \$2,874,859 to the foundation since the current record keeping system was establish, including \$21,136 so far this year for the annual campaign and \$42,137 total.

They share the commitment to service that began in 1907 after the founding of the Rotary Club of Chicago – the first service club in the world.

ROTARY/One Foundation - Ches Perry Fellowship

Chesley R. Perry

(1872 - 1960)

Ches joined the Rotary Club of Chicago in 1908 at 36 years of age and continued to be an active member of our club throughout his lifetime. In 1909 Paul Harris asked Ches to develop a nationwide plan for an association of Rotary Clubs. When the National Association of Rotary Clubs (the forerunner of Rotary International) was founded a year later, Ches began a 31-year career as its General Secretary.

When he retired from Rotary International in 1941 Ches Perry had overseen the incredible expansion of Rotary into a truly effective worldwide organization.

Paul Harris said of Ches, "If I can in truth be called the architect, Ches can with equal truth be called the builder of Rotary International."
